With a 150-year history, Downer is uniquely Queensland.

As an Australian-owned and operated company, Downer has an extensive pedigree in rail manufacturing in Queensland, having built more than 1,000 railcars and almost 1,000 locomotives at our Maryborough facility since the 1860s.



Downer has been Queensland's trusted, collaborative and flexible rollingstock partner for 150 years.

Our iconic Maryborough site has been a lynchpin of the manufacturing industry in Queensland. It is from this site that we have designed and delivered every fleet in Queensland, with the sole exception of the fleet of New Generation Rollingstock.

Having built more than 1,000 railcars and almost 1,000 locomotives from our Maryborough site, Downer has provided Queenslanders with the EMU, ICE, SMU200, IMU100, SMU220, IMU120, IMU160, SMU260, electric tilt trains and diesel tilt train fleets.

All of these cars have been proudly designed in Queensland and built on the Fraser Coast, reaching more than 75 per cent local manufactured content and creating hundreds of local jobs.

Importantly, these Queensland-made trains have also been high quality, high performance trains customised to local requirements.





Relationships creating success

In Queensland, we work hand-in-hand with our customers. The first rolling stock order was to build steam locomotives for the Queensland Government which was received in 1896. Walkers received an order to build 30 B15 class steam locomotives for the Queensland Government Railways. Since then we have worked with our customers on a variety of rolling stock, including with Queensland Rail through our non-traditional commercial model that is all about collaboration.

Downer has a proud history of working with local manufacturing organisations across the Fraser Coast and beyond.

Downer has engaged Allweld on all of our Queensland train projects and also to deliver the mock up used for the NSW Waratah train project. Downer is a strong supporter of Allweld and has showcased their work during a recent supply chain engagement program on the Fraser Coast.

Downer has an established history of manufacturing locomotives from our Maryborough facility. The first trains entered service from 1897, before we went on to build more than 500 steam locomotives between 1896 and 1958. We have subsequently continued to build locomotives at Maryborough through to the most recent diesel-electric GT42 class locomotives

In total, we have manufactured almost 1,000 locomotives including narrow gauge, the 4100 class, 86 class, 4000 class, diesel hydraulic, electric and steam locomotives.
