Welcome to the second edition of the Queensland Train Manufacturing Program (QTMP) First Nations Business Newsletter.

This quarterly update provides support and advice for First Nations-owned businesses on how to tap into opportunities to provide goods and services to QTMP. It includes information about upcoming events, networking opportunities and resources. We also showcase and celebrate First Nations suppliers and employees working on the project.

QTMP will boost local supply chains, engaging Queensland businesses to supply goods and services such as:

- site establishment works
- civil and structural works
- building and utility services
- rail infrastructure
- site services
- site commissioning.

We believe a strong, diverse and self-supporting First Nations business sector is key to empowering Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. It places First Nations business owners, their families, and communities in the driver's seat of their economic future.

Become a QTMP Supplier

If you would like to supply goods and services to QTMP, register on the <u>Supply TMR portal</u>.

- Once you have registered, you will get an email to book a time for a call to help you set up your account and show you how to use the portal. (Please check your junk folder).
- Once your account is set up, you will receive updates about relevant work packages available for tender.
- Make sure your business capabilities are kept up to date.
- As packages are released, the portal will search for required capabilities and notify all relevant businesses.



First Nations-owned business to build QTMP mock-up train

Fraser Coast business Allweld Manufacturing has been contracted to design and build the official project 'mock-up' for QTMP. Based in Tinana, Maryborough, Allweld Manufacturing is a First Nations-owned business established in 1995 and certified with Supply Nation in 2021.

The mock-up will be a life-size model train set built on the Fraser Coast and then transported to Brisbane.

It will be used with various stakeholder groups, including the disability sector, to test the functionality of the QTMP train design. The project will be delivered in two phases throughout the remainder of 2024.

Commencing in March, Phase 1 will involve the construction of a low-fidelity 16-metre-long version of the QTMP train. It will incorporate key functional elements such as the crew cab, passenger toilet area, saloon car seating, doors, and windows. The purpose of this phase is to validate the train's critical dimensions and key relationships between design elements, with the involvement of user groups. The mockup will use state-of-the-art augmented reality technology to enhance the immersion and bring the low-fidelity mock-up to life.

Phase 2 will see Allweld build a high-fidelity mock-up. This will be a full-size, 37-metre-long representation of all interior structures. It will be used to demonstrate and trial the different types of passenger amenities for various user groups.

Southeast success story

Working in partnership

The Butchulla People are the Traditional Custodians of the Torbanlea project area. The QTMP team is collaborating with the Butchulla Native Title Aboriginal Corporation (BNTAC) to consider and deliver opportunities for Butchulla People during construction and manufacturing.



Employee Profile: Rebecca Linwood

Rebecca (Bec) Linwood is employed as a Learning and Development Advisor by Downer. She is a proud Aboriginal woman, local to the Fraser Coast area. Bec has a long history of assisting people to achieve their vocational and nonvocational goals and brings a strong people-centred focus to the QTMP team.

She is keen to enhance people's knowledge of Butchulla lore in the Fraser Coast Area.

Bec is responsible for the coordination, administration and delivery of a range of learning and development activities for QTMP and Downer. This includes promoting career development programs, identifying upskilling opportunities for the local workforce, and liaising with local community groups, industries and schools.

Support, Advice and Resources

Specialist advisors

Downer and its subcontractors will engage additional Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander business specialists to support First Nations-owned suppliers. These advisors will be an important touch point for Indigenous businesses and will provide guidance on supplying to QTMP. In the last newsletter we introduced Rebecca Burke, from DT Infrastructure, who is taking on this important role for the Ormeau rail facility.

To coincide with National Close the Gap Day, QTMP partnered with DTATSIPCA to deliver a networking event for First Nations businesses on 12 March 2024 in Maryborough. This was an opportunity for people from the Fraser Coast region to learn more about how First Nations businesses will be supported in the procurement process and as subcontractors, if engaged by the program. Representatives from Downer and sub-contractor, John Holland Group, provided information about the current supply opportunities available, as well as an overview of the strategies being used to improve recruitment and employment support for First Nations peoples.

The Queensland Train Manufacturing **Program - background**

The QTMP will build 65 new six-car passenger trains at a purpose-built manufacturing facility at Torbanlea, on Butchulla Country in the Fraser Coast region.

A new rail facility site will also be constructed at Ormeau in the Gold Coast region, home to the Yugembeh Language Speaking Peoples.

In June 2023, Downer was awarded the contract to deliver the QTMP. Downer and Hyundai Rotem Corporation (HRC) are in a joint venture to design the new trains.

The two new facilities are being built by subcontractors:

- John Holland Group at Torbanlea.
- DT Infrastructure at Ormeau.
